— Visit spu.edu/internationalapp
- Have your official academic records mailed to us.
- Send us official results of an English proficiency **test** — We require a minimum score of 79 on the iBT (550 paper-based TOEFL), overall band score of 6.5 on the IELTS, 56 on the PTE Academic, or 105 on the Duolingo English Test.
- Optional — Interviews and letters of recommendation

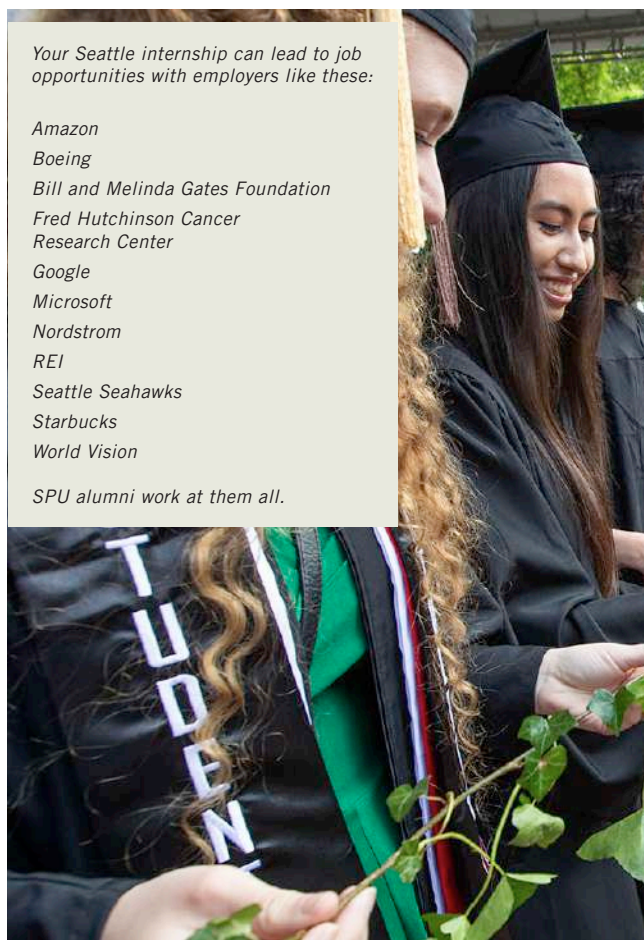

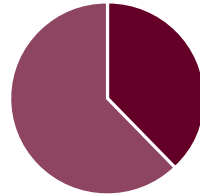

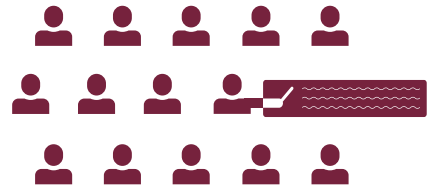
