APPLICATION

FALL 2022 APPLICATIONS ARE DUE JANUARY 15, 2022

Diagnostic Ultrasound applicants must submit a Seattle University Transfer Application.

A COMPLETE APPLICATION INCLUDES:

- Seattle University Transfer Application
- Selection of the track that you would prefer: Cardiac, General or Vascular
- Diagnostic Ultrasound prerequisite form (included in application)
- Seattle University Diagnostic Ultrasound application essay
- Two letters of recommendation (included in application)
- Activity log detailing relevant volunteer or work experience in the medical field
- Official transcripts from each college, university or professional school attended
- If applicable, official AP and CLEP exam scores
- A \$60 application fee (waiver options available)
- If applicable, proof of English proficiency

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

Students for whom English is not a native language will be required to provide proof of English proficiency, regardless of citizenship status, length of time in the U.S. and academic history.

Diagnostic Ultrasound applicants must demonstrate English proficiency at non-English Language Culture Bridge program level. Proof of English proficiency must be received by the application deadline. More information is available on the Admissions website at seattleu.edu/admissions.

ALREADY EARNED YOUR SCIENCE UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE?

Consider enrolling in the Postbaccalaureate Diagnostic Ultrasound Certificate option, allowing you to leverage your education to focus on upper division Diagnostic Ultrasound courses.

PREREQUISITES

All fall 2022 Diagnostic Ultrasound applicants must complete the following prerequisites no later than the end of spring 2022:

- Biology 2200: Anatomy and Physiology I with lab
- Biology 2210: Anatomy and Physiology II with lab
- Physics 1050: Mechanics (algebra-based) with lab
- Physics 1060: Waves, Sound, Electricity and Magnetism (algebra-based) with lab
- MATH 1021: Precalculus Algebra and MATH 1022: Precalculus Trigonometry OR higher level 5-credit MATH course (ex. Calculus or higher)

An associate degree, 90 transferable quarter credits or completion of prior BS or BA degree is required.

For students not completing a transferable associate degree, BS or BA degree, a hands-on art class is also required.

A 3.0 college level cumulative and prerequisite GPA recommended.

A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required in each prerequisite.

Math coursework must be completed within 10 years of application and all science coursework must be completed within five years of application.

No more than two courses can be repeated unless out of date. Please provide a supplemental written statement explaining the reason for the repeated course.
