

### **APPLICATION**

#### FALL 2022 BSN APPLICATIONS ARE DUE DECEMBER 1, 2021

Applicants must submit a Seattle University Transfer Application.

#### A COMPLETE APPLICATION INCLUDES:

- Seattle University Transfer Application
- Seattle University BSN Application Essay
- · Activity log detailing relevant volunteer or work experience
- Official transcripts from each college, university or professional school attended \*Applicants enrolled in Fall 2021 courses must submit their updated transcripts at the end of the term.
- If applicable, official AP and CLEP exam scores
- A \$60 application fee (waiver options available)
- If applicable, proof of English proficiency

The College of Nursing does not require letters of recommendation, Certified Nursing Assistant Certification, ACT/SAT scores or TEAS scores.

#### **BSN APPLICATION ESSAY**

Essay questions allow applicants to reflect on their desire to become a nurse and their interest in Seattle University's Bachelor of Science in Nursing program.

#### **INTERVIEWS**

Candidates selected for interviews will be notified by email. Interviews will be scheduled in the winter.

#### **ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT**

Students for whom English is not a native language will be required to provide proof of English proficiency, regardless of citizenship status, length of time in the U.S. and academic history. BSN applicants must demonstrate English proficiency at non-English Language Culture Bridge program level. Proof of English proficiency must be received by the application deadline. ### PREREQUISITES

APPLICANTS MUST COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING PREREQUISITES NO LATER THAN THE END OF SPRING QUARTER/SEMESTER:

- BIOL 1100: Intro to Cell Biology
- BIOL 1200 + 1210: Anatomy and Physiology I and II with labs
- BIOL 2220: Microbiology with lab
- · CHEM 1200: Intro to Chemistry
- MATH 1210: Statistics
- MATH 1010: College Algebra for Business, Precalculus or higher (Statistics does not meet this requirement)

- NURS 3705: Nutrition
- PSYC 1200: Introductory Psychology
- PSYC 3220: Growth & Development (must cover birth to death lifespan)
- Associate degree, 90 transferable quarter credits or completion of prior BS or BA degree
- Hands-on art class (for students not completing a transferable associate degree, BS or BA degree)

College level cumulative and prerequisite GPA must be 3.0 or higher.

A minimum grade of 2.0 is required in each prerequisite.

Math 1010, nutrition and psychology coursework must be completed within 10 years of anticipated program start date.

Science and Statistics coursework must be completed within five years of anticipated program start date.

Seven of 10 prerequisite courses must be completed by application deadline including at least one Core science (A&P I, A&P II and Microbiology) and one math course (College Algebra for Business/Precalculus or Statistics).

No more than two courses can be repeated unless out of date. Please provide a supplemental written statement explaining the reason for the repeated course.
