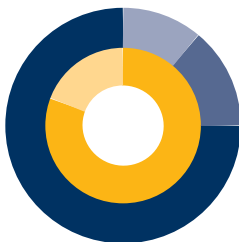

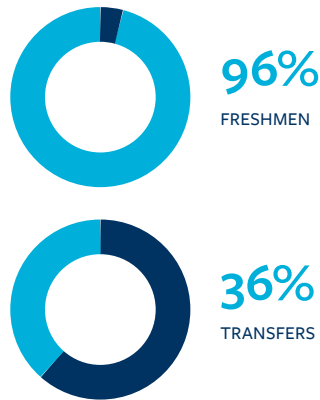
FIND YOUR COMMUNITY & DISCOVER YOUR PASSIONS

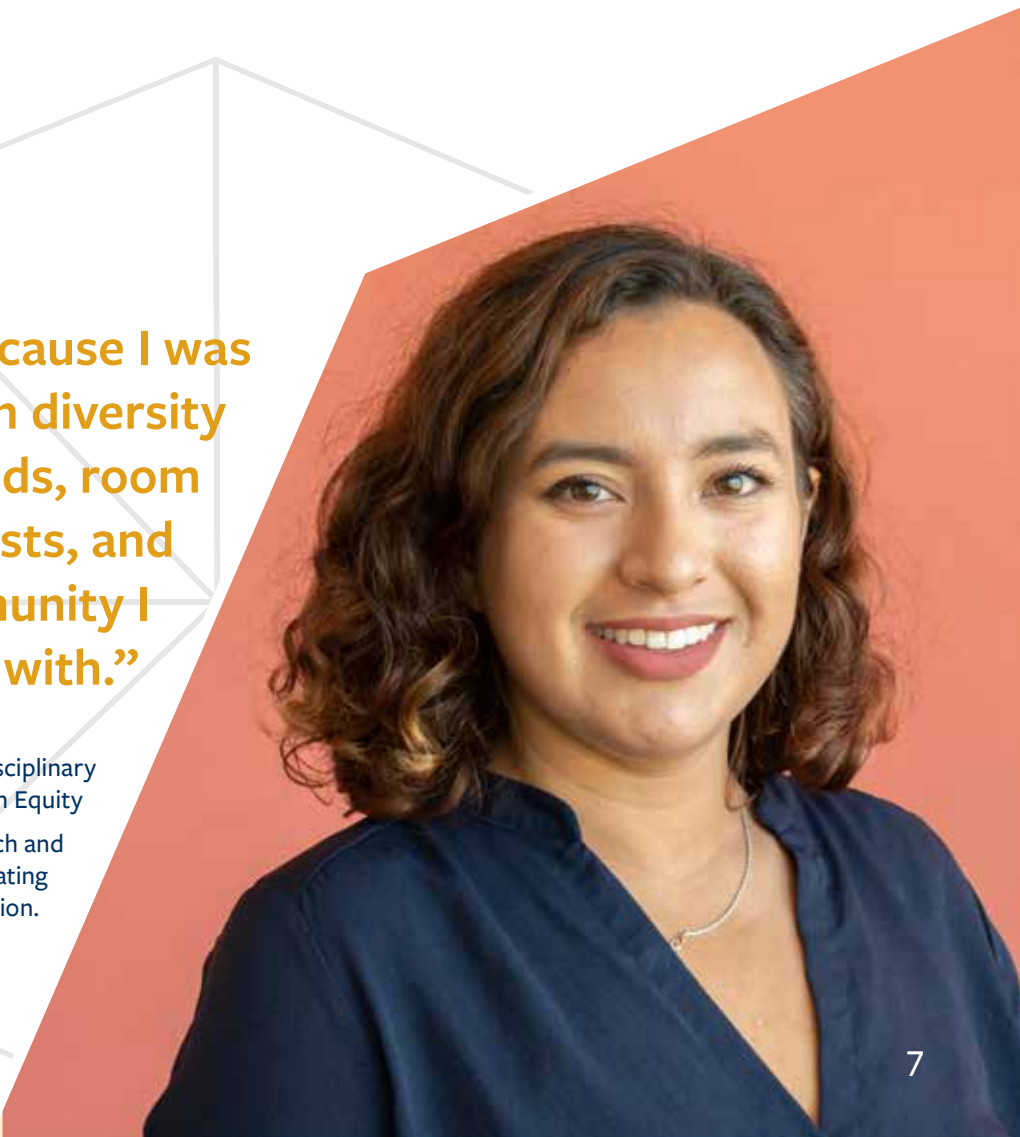

Transfer Applicants

Transfer students make up one-fifth of Berkeley's undergraduate student body, and bring valuable life experiences and diverse perspectives to the campus. Priority is given to California community college students.

A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW PROCESS

To make sure that we see the whole you in your application, we use a comprehensive review process in which all academic and non-academic/personal attributes are considered, but more emphasis is put on academic preparedness for the major.

By the end of the spring term prior to fall admission you will need to:

- > Complete 60 transferable semester units
- > Complete courses for the major
- > Complete general education requirements

INNOVATIVE GRANT AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Berkeley offers a wide range of grants and scholarships — awards that you don't need to repay — and no separate application is required.

BLUE & GOLD OPPORTUNITY PLAN

California residents with family incomes below \$80,000 per year are eligible to receive grants and scholarships to cover the full cost of UC tuition and fees.

MIDDLE CLASS SCHOLARSHIP

California residents with total family income up to \$184,000 may qualify. MCS covers up to 40 percent of UC tuition and fees.

UC BERKELEY SCHOLARSHIPS

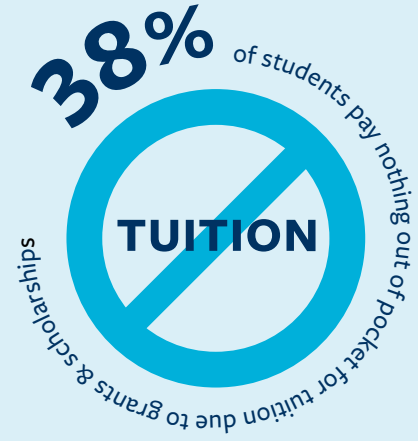
