




WELCOME

ADMISSION requirements

UNDERGRADUATE

- Minimum 2.0 GPA in high school
- Transcripts
- High school or secondary diploma
- Official English Proficiency documentation

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

- TOEFL iBT score or 61 with part scores of 15
- IELTS score of 6.0 with part scores of 6.0
- Depending on location, students with a minimum of three years of study at an institution where English is the principal language of instruction
- Other Acceptable Tests:
 - ACT English score: 22 or higher
 - SAT Verbal score: 500 or higher

TRANSFERS

- Minimum 2.0 GPA
- Transcripts
- · Good standing at current institution
- Official English Proficiency documentation

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY - SPECIAL CONDITIONS MAY APPLY TO TRANSFER STUDENTS

- TOEFL iBT score or 61 with part scores of 15
- IELTS score of 6.0 with part scores of 6.0
- Depending on location, students with a minimum of three years of study at an institution where English is the principal language of instruction
- Students who receive a B or higher in their English composition course at a U.S. institution are exempt from submitting English Proficiency scores

Conditional admission is available to undergraduate degree applicants who are academically qualified with the exception of meeting the English Proficiency requirements.

Applicants may satisfy their English language requirement by successfully completing the Intensive English Program.

GRADUATE

- Equivalent of a bachelor's degree
- Overall 2.5 GPA in the general degree or in the last 60 units attempted
- Many graduate programs have higher than minimum GPA requirements and some will require GRE or GMAT
- Autobiographical essay about yourself, your interests and future plans on a separate sheet of paper (approximately 500 to 750 words)
- · Program specific requirements
- Official English Proficiency documentation

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

- TOEFL iBT 80 with part scores of 20 Reading, 19 Listening, 16 Writing
- IELTS 6.5 Band with part scores of 6.0



 - Spring term by November 1
- Pay Application Fee
- Submit documents: transcripts, academic records, English proficiency

GRADUATE

 - Fall term by May 31
 - Spring term by November 1
- Pay Application Fee
- Submit documents: transcripts, academic records, English proficiency, program specific requirements
- Submit evaluation of academic credentials
- · Submit program application
- Submit GRE/GMAT test scores if applicable

AMERICAN LANGUAGE & CULTURE PROGRAMS

INTENSIVE ENGLISH

Intensive English is a non-credit ESL program that provides non-native Englishspeaking students the opportunity to achieve the English language efficiency for undergraduate admissions to the university. This program is also open to professionals who want to enhance their skills in the English language.

STUDY AT STAN STATE

Students can study at Stan State for one semester or year without going through the formal admission process to the university. Earn university credits that can be transferred to your degree program while embracing the California student life. Study at Stan State offers programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

- TOEFL PBT: 500
- **IELTS: 6.0**




