

APPLICATION REVIEW

We expect students to be academically prepared for success as students at Texas Tech;

therefore, we specifically consider academic performance and educational preparation.

Additional information used to evaluate a student's potential for success includes:

- · Academic rigor
- · Extracurricular activities
- · Leadership experiences
- · Civic or other service activities
- Special talents or awards

If you do not meet the assured admission requirements, we strongly encourage you to respond to essay prompts through the application for admission and submit up to three letters of recommendation.

ACT composite score; SAT reflects evidence-based reading and writing, and math; the highest section scores from multiple tests on the ACT and SAT will be used to maximize score. Assured admission is granted to all students who hold competitive scholarships awarded by an official Texas Tech University scholarship committee. Students applying to biological sciences, business (all), engineering (all), interior design and physics should meet assured admission or be reviewed by the college and accepted into the program. Students who are accepted to Texas Tech but not accepted to these majors will be placed into an Explore program.

If you present the required combination of transferable hours, GPA, and proof of English proficiency, you are assured admission. GPA is cumulative for all transferable courses (including dual credit) from all schools attended. Courses taken for grade replacement are used for GPA calculation only if the same course is repeated at the same institution where it was originally taken.

Students must submit a high school transcript if less than 12 hours have been completed beyond high school.

APPLICATION REVIEW

Transfer students who do not meet assured admission but have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA are evaluated holistically based on the following:

- Academic course selection

- · Leadership experiences

- · Special talents or awards
- · Diversity of experience and background

Students with a cumulative GPA or transferable credit hours below admission requirements or who haven't taken college coursework in the past two or more semesters are encouraged to explain circumstances that have impacted their past academic performance and to submit an essay.

We strongly encourage essays from ApplyTexas or Common App, and up to three letters of recommendation for transfer students entering the review process.


