Nano Stiffarm grew up in the Blackfeet Nation, on Montana's Blackfeet Indian Reservation. From a young age, he saw a need for improving health care in his rural community where addiction was prevalent and access to health care services was dismal. Both of his parents worked at the local hospital, inspiring Stiffarm to enroll in UM's Skaggs School of Pharmacy, where he's completing his doctorate of pharmacy in addition to a master's of business administration in UM's College of Business.


He plans to use his dual degrees to improve the health care near his hometown of Browning, with a goal of becoming a health care leader as a pharmacy supervisor. Stiffarm says his training in business will allow him improve the production and impact of the reservation's pharmacy. Working and volunteering at the pharmacy at the Blackfeet Community Hospital, Stiffarm sees the lack of Native representation of pharmacists and wants to better inform his community about medications, health questions and access.

Stiffarm credits UM's Skaggs School of Pharmacy for supporting him in his personal and professional goals, allowing him to complete pre-pharmacy requirements in two years and maintain a solid grade point average.

UNDERGRADUATE MAJORS

COMMUNICATIVE SCIENCES AND DISORDERS

Our undergraduate degree in Communicative Sciences and Disorders prepares students to go on to seek graduate degrees in speech-language pathology and audiology, as well as related medical and educational fields such as linguistics, education, psychology, neurosciences and physical or

INTEGRATIVE PHYSIOLOGY

Students in this program study, learn, research and promote the mental, social, spiritual and physical aspects of healthy lifestyles while living and working in an active community.

PUBLIC HEALTH

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A Bachelor of Science degree in public health instills the foundational skills required to take on challenging roles in exciting fields that include health education, environmental health and global health.

PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS

MASTER OF ATHLETIC TRAINING (MAT)

Our MAT program gives you the didactic knowledge and clinical skill to promote health physical function and recovery. Our graduates boast an over 90% first-time pass rate on the BOC exam and our students go on to serve as athletic trainers for school athletic programs, local, collegiate and professional sports teams and in hospitals and clinics.

DOCTOR OF PHARMACY (PharmD)

Our flagship program is nationally recognized for its quality patient-centered care and interprofessional training model and activities, rural access outreach programs, student success in passing national pharmacy licensure examination, job placement and matches for postgraduate pharmacy education residencies.

DOCTOR OF PHYSICAL THERAPY (DPT)

As the only program of its kind in Montana, our professional physical therapy degree curriculum prepares practitioners who understand how to prevent primary and secondary disability, rehabilitate injuries, improve mobility and the quality of life for individuals across the lifespan.

MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH (MPH)

Our online MPH program is designed to prepare public health practitioners to improve the health of people in our community and other rural areas. This program allows you to continue working while gaining the skills to influence legislative and social policies, develop multidisciplinary and collaborative strategies for solving health problems and become leaders in health promotion and disease prevention.

MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (MSW)

This professional graduate degree program uses an integrated practice approach to prepare students to address a wide range of concerns and challenges in rural and urban contexts.

MASTER OF SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY (MS-SLP)

This program prepares graduates to become a certified speech-language pathologist able to assess and treat infants, children and adults with acquired or developmental speech, language and/or swallowing disorders.

INTEGRATIVE PHYSIOLOGY (MASTER'S/Ph.D.)

Exercise is medicine! Our generalist, research intensive and applied options in our graduate integrative physiology program give students the knowledge and skills needed to move on to careers in academia, industry or cardiac rehabilitation

MEDICINAL CHEMISTRY/PHARMACEUTICAL SCIENCES AND DRUG DESIGN/TOXICOLOGY (MASTER'S/Ph.D.)

Are you interested in finding novel technologies to help combat the health issues of today and tomorrow? Our graduate programs in medicinal chemistry, pharmaceutical sciences and drug design and toxicology prepare students to develop vaccines and other therapies.

PUBLIC HEALTH (Ph.D.)

When getting an MPH isn't enough, our doctoral program in Public Health prepares the next generation of public health research scientists who will collaborate across disciplines to produce new knowledge that contributes to solving complex health problems of local, regional and global significance.

SPEECH, LANGUAGE AND HEARING SCIENCES (Ph.D.)

Our doctoral program in speech-language and hearing sciences takes the foundational knowledge of the practical master's degree to a whole new level. This research-focused program provides the opportunity for individualized mentorship and specialization in content areas such as literacy, phonology and articulation, acoustics, aphasia and neurorehabilitation and swallowing disorders while also participating in interprofessional team learning settings.
